Due to their exposure to the open air because of the cable trays, the wires contained within need a very durable outer covering. The regulations dictate that the cables must either be Type TC (also known as Tray Rated) or must be metal-armored (Type MC). Cables operating at over 600 volts and those operating at 600 volts or less installed in the same cable tray shall comply with either of the following: (1) The cables operating at over 600 volts are Type MC.
