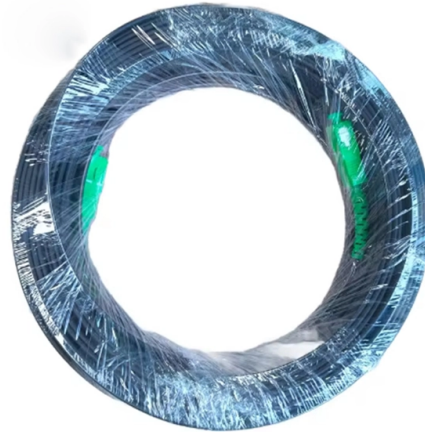


Can wiring be done after the distribution box is moved



Overview

When circuit wiring is too short or the panel is being relocated consider installing a junction box at the old panel location and make all your splices with approved wire connectors or wire nuts. The panel is the central distribution point where the main electrical service enters the home and is then divided into smaller circuits. Relocating an electrical panel is a substantial home improvement project that can vastly improve the safety, functionality, and compliance of your electrical system. Many homeowners consider moving their breaker box for reasons such as home renovations, converting unfinished spaces, or addressing. We remove the wall (in the back of 5 electrical panels in picture) and relocate those five panels to a different location, roughly 10 feet from current location, what're the best options (cost saving, labor) to re-feed the branch circuits (conduits exit below wireway) from new panel location?
